It's been a very a very eventful first two months that I have taken over as President of our August Club and before I proceed to update you on a few things that have happened and are happening, I wish to convey my sincere thanks to Vicky for the great work done by him in 2020-21 and for the support given by Sapna.

The teachers are very committed and enthusiastic and we have been seeking their valuable advice for the project. We endeavor to roll out this project in September.

The second project is the distribution of re -usable sanitary napkins, also known as "Project Red " and is a District thrust project. We are trying to do this in a slum in Mumbai over the next few weeks.

The first saplings in the Fruit tree Sapling Project have been distributed to the farmers and the next lot of saplings are in the distribution pipeline.

We have tried our best to get speakers from diverse fields and we shall continue this endeavor to make it a more interesting experience. Stay safe and wish you'll in advance for the festive Season around the corner.

FRUIT TREE SAPPLINGS PROJECT

The fruit saplings planting project is a District Thrust Area Project. The concept was born when Rotary discovered the plight of poor farmers unable to sell their produce in the market place and had to be at the mercy of middlemen who would give them pittance for the produce. The project has two dimensions, one is to assist the farmer grow fruit trees and the second is to help him reach his produce to the market place subsequently. The project is designed primarily to distribute fruit tree saplings to farmers who own a plot of land in villages near Vikramgad in Palghar district. Planting of fruit trees promotes awareness about the benefit of fruit trees amongst the villagers and would attract more villagers to come forward to benefit from this programme. Saplings of various fruit bearing trees like moringa, limes, papaya, bananas, guava, custard apples, mango and cashew are being distributed.

These saplings are indigenous and conducive to the intended environment benefits -

- 1) Reducing the impact of global warming.
- 2) Green urban areas and water conservation, stabilizing ground cover
- 3) Food security
- 4) Promotes healthy ecosystem, increasing biodiversity
- 5) Balancing the need for agricultural lands by providing spaces in urban areas for food cultivation.

Getting involved

- 1) Our member contribution in this project will go a long way in uplifting the life of and individual farmer family.
- 2) NGO global Parli are partnering Rotary in this project and are committed to supervise and give full technical support to the farmers so that the farmers do it the right way and they can start reaping fruits within 2-3 years.
- 3) With a small investment/contribution of Rs.12000/- given to the by way of saplings for his plot of land , the farmer can earn up to Rs.50000/- every year.

Role of Media in Influencing Civil Societies

On 7/7/21 Dr Mukesh Sharma, spoke on a very important and relevant topic in today's day and age - Role of media in influencing civil societies. Dr Sharma was responsible for the turnaround of Doordarshan and started his career at Doordarshan Lucknow. He likened today's media like a Raavan with 10 heads (1) TV (2) Radio Stations (3) Cinema (4) Animation (5) Bill Boards (6) Music (7) Live Entertainment (8) On line gaming (9) Digital (10) Social Media. The two most relevant are streaming and social media.



There are no broadcasting laws in place for the TV Media today in India and there are 900 odd channels to contend with, as a result we are now more fragmented as a society. We don't have a broadcaster that is independent. The need of the hour is to be careful and not spread poison, there should be a wholesome balance in reporting and Prasar Bharati should be an autonomous body with public funding like BBC, Deutsch Weller. On social media fake news travels the world six times faster. Technology being so easy that one can create fake news and people don't have time to verify the facts. It is important to plug fake news, by simply not forwarding. He fielded some very interesting questions by members with aplomb.

Humour in Advertising



On 14/7/21 Paritosh Joshi, spoke about humour in advertising. He is a multifaceted personality, a veteran in his field, he is the head of Provocateur Advisory, and is founder CEO Star CJ network India P Ltd. He peppered his talk with displays of cartoons, and said the best way to resolve tension, in a pleasing way is with humour. In advertising, humour enables you to pick up an audience, one has to woo the target audience with humour. An example of Ceat Tyres ad, shows a person riding a bike in a congested road in Mumbai, when a cyclist hops in front of him, a pedestrian crosses without looking and the biker has to apply the brakes suddenly, which the tyres are able to take without skidding! Another humorous ad which is not at all glitzy and glossy, simple but funny... Thaggu ke ladoos... a famous ladoowalla in Kanpur... I stole your heart by giving you sweet ladoos, was the essence of the ad. In a lighter vein, he pointed out that people like to go to doctors who don't take themselves seriously, and put their patients at ease, with their sense of humour. People, he says like people who like to laugh at themselves.

Covering Natural Disasters - Responsibilities & Challenges

On 28/7/21 Ms Vinaya Deshpande, Mumbai Bureau Chief of CNN News 18, speaks on roles, responsibilities and challenges for covering natural disasters. She has covered scoops in defence deals, oil spills and the recent floods in Maharashtra, which she says is a disaster of a massive scale. Visuals of a disaster are too huge to shrug off, especially in rural areas, where villagers though are very resilient are unable to cope, they need potable water, chlorine tablets, pain relievers, covid testing could not be done, and people are unable to wear masks. She went with the Indian Army to cover the rescue operations in Sangli, which saw zero casualties with two lakh people evacuated.



The army did a commendable job and went beyond the call of duty. She mentioned that journalists do this kind of reporting to make us aware of the situation, if they did not do it, then there are people who can deny the gravity of such disasters. She also brought out the positive side of situation by showing how random citizens come out to help in such times, by doing selfless acts like cleaning the drains or warning the public about open drains. We all admired this lady for her courage and conviction, who simply loves her job, despite the inherent dangers!

Simultaneous Elections - an Excellent Idea or an Awful Idea

On 4/8/21 Mr Dorab Sopariwala, Editorial Advisor for NDTV spoke on the topic of Simultaneous Elections – and excellent idea or an awful idea? The idea of simultaneous elections was first floated by Mr L K Advani. Most European democracies have such an arrangement, however it has not worked satisfactorily and in UK, Spain, Italy, Germany, many elections were held. In Germany the Bundestag cannot be dissolved unless by a constructive vote of no confidence, hence no fixed term Parliament can be dissolved by vote of no confidence. In India national elections are held on time, but not the state elections. We are in election mode all the time as now the state elections are taking longer to complete, than before, despite progress being made in infrastructure. If therefore elections are held constructive vote of no confidence, hence no fixed term Parliament can be dissolved by vote of no confidence. In India national elections are held on time, but not the state elections. We are in election mode all the time as now the state elections are taking longer to complete, than before, despite progress being made in infrastructure. If therefore elections are held simultaneously, although there will be cost saving, the whole country can close down for 90 days or more! What is the impact on democracy if the Central Govt falls after 2 years and no Govt can be formed? How will the Govt function? How will the budget be passed if there is no Govt, because of the simultaneous election pattern to be followed? The country cannot run indefinitely on Presidents and Governor's rule.



Handling Stress During the Pandemic

On 11/8/21 Swami Purnachaitanya, a spiritual guide and an enthralling story teller spoke on Handling Stress During Pandemic – Mastering the Mind. While in SA during the lockdown, he wrote a book on how to deal with the changing world. Everything around us can change any time, and then you realise that unless you know how to manage your mind you cant cope or sleep well at night. Meditation teaches the mind to be focused and relaxed at the same time, and the mind functions best when relaxed. He advises that one should live one's life as an should live one's life as an expression of

happiness instead of in pursuit of happiness. Live for the moment, we are on earth for a special purpose and God has given us skills to achieve that higher purpose !

“ Care, Share and Rejoice ”

18/8/21 Desiree Punwani spoke on Hopelessness to Shining Self. She spoke from her heart, narrating her own experience of overcoming alcohol addiction. She is a certified councilor and draws she strength from Buddhism, and has authored a book “In High Spirits”. She was so addicted that she needed alcohol to function, she attended AA meetings, which didn't help. What helped was her determination to be a good mother to her young children , she helped was her determination to be a good mother to her young children , she stated basic steps like, simplify and purify your life, get rid of baggage, care share and rejoice, take responsibility for your actions, by admitting to your addiction, one can avoid being insulted. An interesting point she brought out is that anger, greed, need to control people, drinking too much coffee, computers games can all be addictive. One must leave a good legacy for the children, and so being paranoid and neurotic does not help, what helps is the support of the family, which she received in plenty.



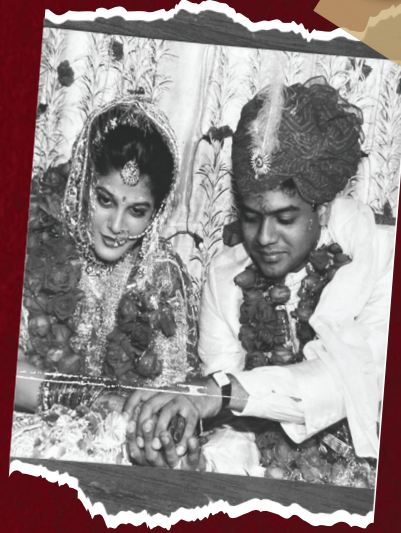
“ Each One Teach One ”

On 25/8/21 Jyoti Tanna spoke on the topic of My Journey Leading To Founding of Each One Teach One. Ms Tanna spoke at length with emotion about her very difficult youth. She had 17 siblings, one of 9 , girls born in a Sindhi family, that migrated from Pakistan during the partition. Times were very tough and the family could not educate all the childred, however the brothers were educated, and she was not which made her a very bitter person. Her sister enabled her to complete her matriculation, her brother managed to get her admission in a college but could not afford her fees. She managed to get a job at Motwane's , then at Mazgaon docks. Her journey to founding the EOTO scheme began when after her marriage to Mr Tanna , she would notice 5 children sitting on the footpath with school bags and begging at the signals, upon enquiring she found out that the children could not afford books and uniforms , so were not permitted to enter the school. They would go back home after school time was over, making the parents believe that they were in school all along. She decided to pay for their fees and uniforms. 3 students completed the schooling, 2 ran away. This prompted her to start educating the street children. EOTO was founded in 1984, funds came in from her friends and very supportive husband and in laws. Today there are 5000 children studying in Palghar, Neral, Virar. Ex-students are the backbone of EOTO and the children are provided with books, education and food. What a fulfilling journey for a lady who suffered in her youth and gave her all, so that other children do not feel the pain of lack of education, like she did!
